Mr Langenegger: Has a decision for Resident Day Use fee been decided? If a fee is not charged, then NM State Parks would forfeit a substantial source of revenue, as much as \$858,000/year. In addition, potential negative impacts (parking issues, overuse of natural resources and infrastructure, increased park maintenance, and personnel interactions) may result with the elimination of a day use fee for NM residents.

I am an out-of-state resident that relies on the Annual Day Use (ADU) Pass. The revised non-resident ADU pass fee increase (275%) is substantially greater than other increases (< 166%) from changes in other current fees. An increase of the NM resident ADU pass to \$80 and that of non-resident to \$120, would reduce the yearly estimated revenue impact by about \$4,300. Furthermore, ADU passes should be issued yearly not for 12 mo from date of purchase. This would reduce costs for issuing ADU (and other?) passes.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments about NM State Park fees. I concur that adjustments for fees are necessary to attain a sustainable NM park enterprise that depends on fees for 70-75% of your annual expenses.
